Cooper Pedy Together

Thankyou to all those who attended the recent Cooper Pedy Together events held since our last newsletter. I think it was a great success particularly having regard for the cross section of people in attendance. As advised last month, this process was kicked off in 2019 by a group of energetic citizens keen to develop a plan for the town. While a lot of work was done by the group, the pandemic unfortunately intervened. Cooper Pedy Together is designed to reactivate this process. It is important that over coming months we get as many people involved as possible. Also, it is important that we form a Leadership Group for the project. While the Council is funding the process on your behalf, it does not want to be seen to be leading it. This needs to be led by the community.

COVID Preparedness

Vaccination rates continue to be low in Cooper Pedy and the Far North when compared to other parts of the State. If you intend to get vaccinated please do so as quickly as possible. This will help to ensure our health system is not overwhelming. Due to our vaccination rates a specific plan has been devised for Cooper Pedy and the Far North to deal with an outbreak. State Election

The State Election will be held on Saturday 19 March 2022. It is important that Cooper Pedy draw to the attention of the State Government things requiring State Government attention. Such a document is being prepared by the Council for release and discussion with the candidates for the electorate of Giles two months before the election. This document will be informed by the Cooper Pedy Together process and in subsequent years will be prepared by its leadership group.

Smart Metres

The roll out of the Smart Metres Project for electricity in Cooper Pedy is the largest project undertaken in the town for some years. It has been relatively problem free which is a testament to all involved. These metres will allow electricity users to monitor their electricity use and cost in real time.

Water Security and Equity

As you would hopefully be aware, the Council is seeking to significantly upgrade the town's water production and reticulation system. The Council's objectives are two fold - to ensure the town's water security for the long term and to achieve water pricing equity with SA Water consumers.

In last month's newsletter, I advised you that the Council anticipated being in a position to award the tender by the end of the calendar year. Following a visit to Cooper Pedy by the prospective tenders in recent weeks, it has become clear that our contractual and service documentation, and information is deficient. As a consequence, it has been necessary to postpone the closing date for tenders. In the coming weeks a revised closing date will be provided to prospective tenders.

I again take the opportunity to remind you that It is the expectation of the Council that if tenderers are unable to provide water in Cooper Pedy at SA Water prices the State Government will either provide a subsidy or a capital grant to achieve this.

The tender requires the operator to buy the existing water system from the Council. It is valued at approximately \$10 million. This will enable the Council to either retire all of its debt or to use its borrowing capacity to invest in other community infrastructure such as roads.

The tender also requires the operator to transfer ownership of the system to the Council at the end of the agreement period.

The Sisters is a network of women from across the Coober Pedy Community including business, agencies, services and mining. These women are concerned by the DV statistics in the community, and create a gentle, loving and supportive environment for those affected by DV. They will welcome you, just like a sister would. The group emerged after International Women's Day this year and are sponsored by Peak Iron Mines. Looking After Your Pets in the Heat

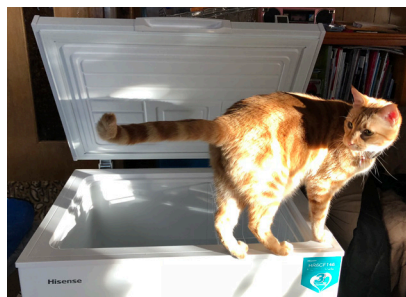
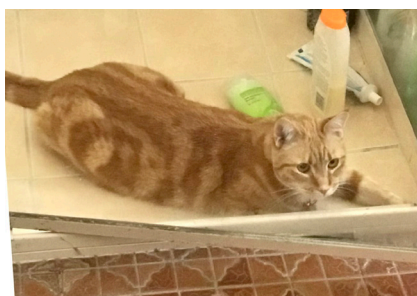
Dogs, cats, and birds all feel the heat in the same way we do. If you're feeling hot, they are too! Make sure your pet has access to a cool space, some shelter, and plenty of water. Many retailers sell cooling mats, which can help your pet regulate their own temperature by allowing them to choose when to lay down and cool off. Why not consider making some frozen treats? These treats will not only keep your pet cool, but will also be a source of entertainment.

Dogs and cats don't sweat like humans do, they sweat only through their paws. Dogs and Cats will pant to try and cool themselves down, and cats will lick themselves excessively to try and dampen their fur. If you notice your pet doing any of these things, bring them into a cooler area and give them a bowl of fresh water.

Consider a fur cut! If your pet is extra furry, you may want to give them a new 'do. Many locals shave their pets in the summer months to help them keep cool. Just don't go too short! You don't want to risk sunburn.

Rules for Walking Fido:

It is important to ensure your dog doesn't miss out on their exercise while the weather is extreme. The best times to walk your dog will be early morning and late evening, avoiding the heat of the day. The biggest obstacle is of course the temperature of the ground. A dog's paws are as sensitive as the back of your hand, and they can be burnt very easily. Before you start your walk, take your hand and place the back of it on the ground, leaving it there for 5 seconds. If it's too hot or uncomfortable for your hand, then it's not safe for your dog. Alternatively, you could get Fido a nice new set of shoes!

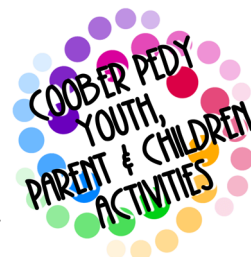

A Spooktacular Time

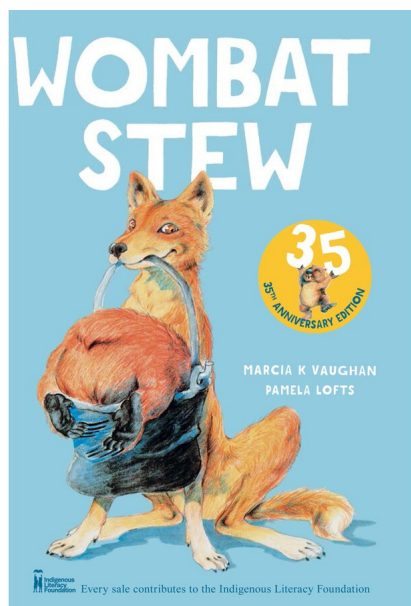
