"It will be the culmination of an action-packed and exciting week which also includes a Centenary Street Party on April 2, with food and live music; the 100-Year Ball on April 3; the Opal Festival on April 4 and the Coober Pedy Gem Trade Show on April 4 and 5".

Other Centenary events throughout the year are the Australia Day commemoration on January 26, with Coober Pedy Ambassador Maggie Beer; the Centenary Launch on February 1; the Great Breakaways Bold on May 23; the Harmony Day Multicultural Festival in March or June; and the Coober Pedy Races and Gymkhana on August 8 and 9.

A working group is being formed to finalise details of the Reunion Lunch and attendance cost is expected to be finalised some time in August.



MAYORS REPORT July 2014

Mayor Steve Baines

I am pleased to advise that Councils CEO, Phil Cameron has officially exercised his right to extend his current employment contract with Council.

Phil's current contract expires on the 23rd April 2015 and Phil has chosen to take up the option of a two year extension in accordance with clause 4.1 of his contract.

Clause 4.1 of the current agreement states that the right of extension is at the sole discretion of the CEO. Accordingly, the Council is bound by Mr Cameron's decision to extend the term, given that he has achieved 'Competent Performance' as defined.

You will recall that the CEO's Performance Review was undertaken on the 21st May 2014 and the panel found that Competent Performance was achieved and the CEO's performance met expectations. This finding was accepted by Council via resolution on the 17th June 2014.

I have sought advice from Satish Dasan from Norman Waterhouse who drafted the original contract in regard to the extension and have received the following.

Clause 5.3 requires that if an extension is sought, the parties must enter into a new contract of employment. This means that the extension cannot be achieved simply in an exchange of correspondence between the parties.

The new employment agreement can be drafted in almost identical terms to the current agreement, if both parties are happy with the content. There will simply be a need to make a number of administrative changes. I recommend that this new agreement be signed and finalised before the expiry date of the current agreement, being 23 April 2015. Accordingly, I suggest that this extension be dealt with before the caretaker provisions of the Local Government Act 7999 (SA) take effect.

On this basis I have instructed Mr Dasan to undertake the required administrative changes and will endorse the contract once received.

The changes for commercial and domestic electricity tariffs came into effect on the 1st July 2014 as promised by the state government prior to the South Australian State Elections.

It has been a long hard road trying to get pricing equality for our residents and businesses and I thank everyone involved who offered support in the lead up to the state elections for their assistance, particularly those involved in the OPAL campaign.

COMMUNITY REPRESENTATIVE ON CPAMP WORKING PARTY APPOINTED

Residents may recall that some time ago Council received funding to formulate an Alcohol Management Plan for the town of Coober Pedy. This plan carries on from the Alcohol restrictions implemented late last year and contains over 80 recommendations and actions to further address the alcohol issues in Coober Pedy. After extensive public consultation the plan was adopted by Council in October last year.

The Terms of Reference of the Coober Pedy Alcohol Management Plan(CPAMP) Working Party outline a number of community sectors with representation on the committee which includes:

- AMYAC representing the Aboriginal Community
- Multicultural Community Forum representing older persons with other cultural backgrounds
- One elected member representing ratepayers and the wider community
- Coober Pedy Retail Business and Tourism Association representing the business sector
- CP ACCORD Committee- one representative linking this group with the Working Party

Another position to a more general community representative was recently advertised for.

The CPAMP Working Party was requested to form a Sub Group which consisted of Cr Rose Berry, Susie Crisa, Lisa McClure and Chris Crismani to consider any expressions of interest received from the Coober Pedy community.

Process:

- The Sub Group met to consider three expressions of interest received by Council
- One applicant did not address the predetermined criteria and was eliminated from further consideration
- Two applicants were invited to meet with the Sub Group for an informal discussion/interview
- A suitable applicant was determined by their responses and discussion points at this meeting
- The Sub Group reported back to the full Working Party with a recommendation; a motion of the full Working Party was passed to accept their recommendation for Sharyn Baines to join the working party as a community representative
- Council then endorsed Sharyn Baines as a community representative on the CPAMP Working Party at its meeting held during July

Council congratulates Sharyn on becoming the community representative on the working party.

After dinner and the award ceremony the music started and the young people had a great time dancing away until 11:00pm that night.


It was a fantastic night and all that attended enjoyed.
